In Chicago and the Eastern region, prices were unchanged to higher on mediums. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged steady to fully steady on medium eggs, about steady on the larger sizes. Demand remained mixed, slow to fairly good, mostly moderate, with retail promotional activity usually generating the best pull. Supplies of the larger sizes were generally adequate to instances fully adequate, and

Wheat bids lower, corn and soybean bids narrowly mixed. Wheat steady to 9 cents lower. Corn steady to 3 cents lower except So. Iowa 1 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 1 cent lower. Soybeans mostly steady to 2 cents higher. Lack of fresh foreign orders this week added pressure to wheat bids. Large stock carry over continued to weigh on bids. Recent higher trends on the Board increased farmer selling and bids fell slightly lower. Additional pressure stemmed from active harvest. Another good export order for corn, limited declines. Soybean bids showed slight strength due to some fund buying on the Board and stronger meal demand. Dry conditions continue in Brazil. Harvest progress is going well for both corn and beans with good yields being reported. Corn harvest is well ahead of normal.
