

## **Market Steers Judged At Perry Fairgrounds**

## National Organic Standards Board To Meet Oct. 25-28

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Organic Standards Board (NOSB) will meet Oct. 25-28 in USDA's South Building, 1400 Independence Avenue, SW, Room 3501-S, Washington, D.C.

Meetings will run from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Oct. 25 and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Oct. 26-28. All meetings are open to the public.


"This meeting is being held to hear committee reports and make recommendations on whether 16 materials will be included on the proposed National List," said Kathleen Merrigan, administrator of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service. "The 16 materials are being considered for use in organic crop and livestock production and processing." The NOSB, which grew out of

The NOSB, which grew out of the Organic Foods Production Act of 1990, met for the first time in March 1992. It has six committees, which address issues related to crop standards, processing, labeling and packaging, livestock standards, accreditation, materials, and international issues.

On Dec. 16, 1997, USDA published its proposed rule for the National Organic Program in the Federal Register. The period for public comment on the proposed rule was extended through April 30, 1998, and resulted in an outpouring of 275,000 comments.

Time has been scheduled for public input on Oct. 25, from 1:15 p.m. to 5 p.m. For more information, call (202) 720-3252.
