EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, OCTOBER 15, 1999, FEDERAL-STATE

Majority prices on whole eggs and whites were unchanged, yolk products were slightly higher but the trade sentiment was steady. Offerings were slightly increased in late week on yolks, and other items were adequate for a fair demand. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 9, 1999 were 3% more than last week, and 2% less than last year. Shell egg supplies were still ample for needs.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained generally good and was sufficient to keep the bulk of offerings in good balance to well cleared. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 51 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate to ample. Bone-in breasts were adequate to barely adequate. Legs, leg quarters and drums were at least adequate. Thighs were irregularly available. Wings were ample.
