Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 9, 1999 were 3% more than last week, and 2 % less than last year. Shell egg supplies were still ample for needs.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained generally good and was sufficient to keep the bulk of offerings in good balance to well cleared. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 51 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, boncless skinless breasts were fully adequate to ample. Bone-in breasts were adequate to barely adequate. Legs, leg quarters and drums were at least adequate. Thighs were irregularly available. Wings were ample.


