 Wheat finished slightly lower on spill-over weakness from a lower Board. Good overnight export sale to Egypt but traders felt this had been factored in earlier. Cash corn bids were mixed but mostly higher with fund buying and good early week export interest major factors. Weakness, as in lower soybean bids was due to the ongoing harvest progress. Lower soybean bids were also influenced by rainfall in Brazil. Wheat 2 to 7 cents lower. Corn mixed.

Sorghum steady to 3 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 7 cents lower.

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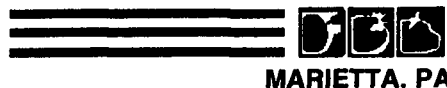
