Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained sufficient to keep the bulk of offerings cleared satisfactorily, particularly on the 3 pound sizes which were generally noted as tight. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 52 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to firm. In the parts complex bone-in breasts were adequate to well cleared. Wings remained tight at some plants, fully adequate elsewhere. Leg items and boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate for immediate needs
