CATTLE: Compared to Tuesday, slaughter steers and heifers sold firm to .50 higher. Buyers had to lower their standards a bit to fill orders, as high quality cattle are in short supply. A light run of Holstein steers sold .50- 1.00 higher. Slaughter cows sold weak to .50 lower, except for high boning yield Lean cows over 1200 lbs which traded firm to 1.00 higher. Slaughter bull demand was light and prices were .50-1.00 lower. Supply included 33 percent slaughter steers and 39 percent slaughter

Trading was uneven for Holstein bulls returning to feed, with little difference between Number 1 and 2 calves. Prices ranged 25.00-40.00 higher. The demand has eased up for Holstein heifers and sales were weak to 20.00 lower. Supply included 425 head in the State graded sale with around 86 percent returning to feed.

CATTLE: Compared to last week's closing prices, slaughter steers and heifers sold firm to .50 higher. Supply continues tight and demand was very good as buyers were quick to bid on any cattle that appeared to have a chance of grading Choice, and were fairly lenient on some that may not. We are in the midst of a sellers market for those producers that have Choice and Prime cattle, and the shortage should last for at least another month. The boxed beef market moved slightly lower this week, but Western feedlots traded steady to firm. Midwestern cattle sold from 69.00-70.00 and 109.00 to mostly 110.00 dressed. Local Holstein steer trading was active and prices ended .50- 1.00 higher. A large run of slaughter cows closed mostly .50 lower this past week and slaughter bulls sold 1.00-2.00 lower in slow trading. Supply included 35 percent slaughter steers, 6 percent slaughter heifers, 41 percent slaughter cows, 4 percent bulls, with the balance feeders.
