USDA-MO Dept Ag Market News Daily National Grain Market Summary Grain and soybean bids extended gains, today, as export optimism and some fund buying offered strength. Wheat 1 to 9 cents higher. Corn 2 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 4 to 5 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 4 cents higher. Export sales have been slow for wheat this week, however, indications that Pakistan and possibly Egypt will soon be in the market pushed prices higher. Taiwan is tendering tomorrow. Dry weather in southern Plains regions gave support to winter wheat bids. Corn bids were slightly higher due to good export sales this week and some fund buying on the Board. Private sources showed a small increase in U.S. corn production is likely, which limited gains. Slight gains in soybean bids were due to stronger meal and oil prices and higher corn and wheat bids. Soybean production is expected to be lowered by USDA next week, according to private sources.


