Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was seasonally sluggish as buyers interest shifted to other items more commonly used during the thanksgiving holiday. Offerings were in good balance on the over 3 pound sizes; readily available on the lighter weights. Live supplies were moderate; weights mostly desirable to light. Processing schedules increased compared to the last several days and were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 60 to 72 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. 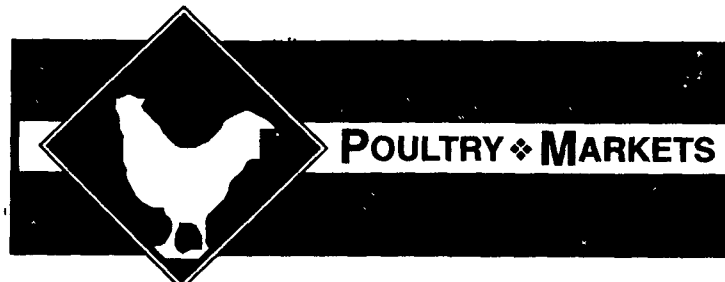

IN PHILADELPHIA, PRICES FOR EXTRA LARGE AND LARGE WERE UNCHANGED TO THREE CENTS LOWER, AND MEDIUMS WERE UNCHANGED. IN BOSTON, EXTRA LARGE AND LARGE WERE UNCHANGED TO FIVE CENTS LOWER, AND MEDIUMS WERE UNCHANGED TO TWO CENTS LOWER. PRICES TO PRODUCERS IN NEW ENGLAND WERE FIVE CENTS LOWER FOR EXTRA LARGE AND LARGE, TWO CENTS LOWER FOR MEDIUMS AND SMALLS, AND UNCHANGED ON JUMBO. THE MARKET TONE WAS BARELY STEADY TO WEAK ON WHITE EGGS AND UNSETTLED TO WEAK ON BROWN EGGS. DEMAND WAS FAIR TO GOOD AS RETAILERS CONCENTRATED ON LAST MINUTE DELIVERIES PRIOR TO THE HOLIDAY. SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE WITH LARGER SIZES MORE AVAILABLE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE FULLY ADEQUATE TO AMPLE FOR THE REDUCED HOLIDAY BREAKING SCHEDULES. LIGHT TYPE FOWL AVAILABILITY WAS SUFFICIENT FOR NEEDS.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, NOVEMBER 19, 1999. FEDERAL-STATE

Mostly prices were unchanged when compared to a week earlier. Demand was only fair for usually adequate offerings. The undertone was no better than barely steady at prevailing price levels. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 13, 1999 were 6% more than last week, and 5% less than a year ago. Shell egg supplies were adequate to ample.
