NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE

Prices continued unchanged to lower throughout the country. The market tone ranged steady at times to mostly weak, with the larger sizes in the weakest position. Retail demand was moderate to mostly good as the Thanksgiving holiday continued to stimulate seasonal consumer interest. Supplies of all sizes were available to ample, however, the extra large and large sizes were usually in the longest position. Breaking stock supplies were fully adequate to instances burdensome from regular sources, and demand for additional product was very limited. Light type hens were fully adequate for current processors' needs.


