ALCOTT'S "LITTLE" WOMEN

n November 29, 1832, Amos Bronson Alcott, transcendentalist and founder of a utopian community in Fruitlands, Massachusetts, wrote a letter to convey his pride in "the birth of a second daughter on my own birth-day." Born in "the most disagreeable month in the whole year," as Louisa's fictional



character, Margaret, called it in Little Women, Louisa and her father were both avid journal keepers Louisa's books and articles later supported the family through their financial troubles. Louisa died on March 4, 1888, two days after her father's death.

I had a pleasant time with my mind, for it was happy. - Louisa May Alcott, diary entry 1843

Cook, stirring, until thickened, then add potatoes and parsley, and spoon into a deep-dish pie pan or soufflé dish Top with biscuits (halved from normal size) and bake for 15 minutes at 400° F


