Values generally ranged from unchanged to lower when compared to a week earlier. Offerings were adequate for the light demand. The undertone was at best barely steady at prevailing price levels. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 20, 1999 were 9% less than last week, and 14% less than a year ago. Shell egg supplies were fully adequate to ample for trade needs.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was disappointingly slow. Seller offerings varied from fully adequate to readily available and difficult to clear. Live supplies were seasonally moderate, weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were irregular, but moderate in total. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at

59 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly weak. In the parts complex, most items were noted as at least adequate. Breast items were noted at highly competitive price levels in an attempt to clear accumulating stocks.
