NATIONAL EGG MARKET AT A GLANCE

In the Eastern region prices were unchanged to lower on all sizes. In Chicago prices were lower on extra large and large eggs. Elsewhere prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged barely steady to mostly weak with the larger sizes continuing in the weakest position. Demand was mixed in a full range at times but was usually fair to moderate with better interest noted for the scattered feature activity. Supplies of the larger sizes were generally ample and the lighter weights were at least adequate to fully adequate. Breaking stock supplies were fully adequate from regular sources and demand was often limited with additional quality product becoming available. Light type hens were fully adequate for current processors' schedules.

Daily National Grain Market Summary  
Higher wheat bids again with commercial buying and export interest the major support factors. Forecasts call for possible moisture in the southern Plains areas but the chance is small. Jordan is reported to have bought 4 million bushels of hard red winter wheat overnight but it may have been Argentine wheat. Corn bids followed wheat higher again today. Good overnight sales to Taiwan boosted bids. Soybean bids declined after yesterday's sharp advances. Some profit taking was noted on the Board and very light export interest weighed on bids. Continued dry weather in Brazil, limited losses. Wheat steady to 2 cents higher. Corn 1 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 1 to 4 cents higher. Soybeans steady to 6 cents lower.

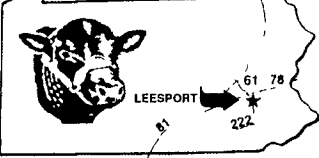

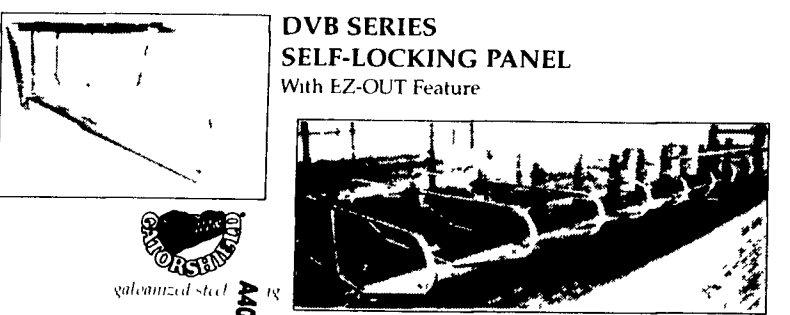

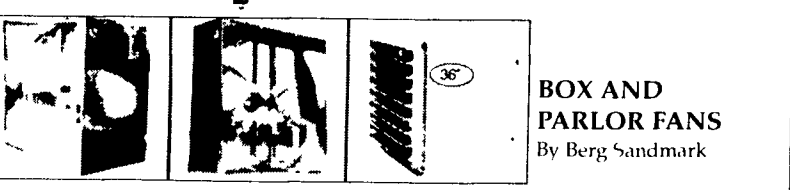
