# Ag By-Product **Technology Bill Earns House Approval**

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) -The House of Representatives recently approved legislation introduced by Sheila Miller (R-129) that encourages the use and development of environmentally sound and affordable methods of managing manure and other animal by-products.

"By-product management is one of the most important aspects of modern farming," Miller said. "These technologies can turn waste into energy, pathogen-free fertilizers and animal feed supplements, all of which help farms operate more efficiently and keep the environment free of potential air and water pollutants.

The Agricultural By-Product Technology Act requires the Department of Agriculture to evaluate new management practices and promote the education and use of those practices

through grant and loan programs.

"Many farmers are anxious to try new technologies, but getting started can be costly," Miller said "Grants and loans will give them the help they need to put these technologies to use, and the evaluations will help them determine what type of technology might be most effective at their farm."

House Bill 1757 also creates the Agriculture By-Product Technology Board, which would work with the Department of Agriculture to research and evaluate new technologies. Additionally, the board would be responsible for assessing regional manure and by-product reduction needs and for encouraging cooperation among the agricultural community, industry and local government regarding the use and development of the new technologies
