NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE

In the Eastern region, prices were unchanged to slightly higher. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged steady to firm, mostly steady to fully steady. Demand was generally moderate to fairly good at times, and often noted as improving with seasonal interest. Supplies of all sizes were usually adequate to available. However, in the North Central region, availability of the lighter weights were limited at times, in addition, offerings of all sizes were generally light on the West Coast. Breaking stock supplies were at least adequate to ample from regular sources, and demand for additional product continued unaggressive. Light type hens were fully sufficient for current slaughter requirements.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET, FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slow. Seller offerings remained readily available with spot sales noted as low as 40 to 41 cents in an effort stimulate activity. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy, mostly desirable to light. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 55 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly weak. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for the seasonally light and unaggressive buying interest.
