Light export sales, fund selling, and large World competition kept a lid on bids. Wheat 1 cent higher to 1 cent lower. Corn mostly steady. Sorghum steady. Soybeans mixed. Light corn and soybean sales to South Korea ovemight but nothing large enough to push bids higher. Argentina is still an aggressive seller of wheat. China is reported to have bought at least one cargo of US beans in the past few days. There was some fund positioning in com pits.




