## Cancel Needless Mortgage Insurance

Homeowners can save hundreds of dollars a year thanks to a law that makes it easier to cancel private mortgage insurance (PMI). PMI is an insurance policy that protects lenders from losses on low down-payment loans. Lenders typically require PMI for borrowers who make a down payment of less than 20 percent of the home value.

Under the Homeowners Protection Act of 1998, a PMI
