Extension Specialist Elected

NEWARK, Del. - Ed Kee, cooperative extension specialist for vegetable crops for the University of Delaware, has been elected president of the North America Pulse Crop Improvement Association. "A pulse is an edible legume crop such as peas, soybeans and pea-

nuts," said Kee. "Legumes interact at the molecular level with the bacterium Rhizobium ('living root'), which allows the plant to take nitrogen from the air and use it in the same manner as nitrogen from the soil," he said. "The relationship between the plant and the bacterium is a mutually beneficial relationship: the bacteria supply the plant with

nitrogen and the plant provides the bacteria with carbohydrates and other organic compounds."

The Pulse Crop Improvement Association primarily represents the seed industry and the research community throughout North American, said Kee, who has served on the board for four years and just finished a term as vice president and program chair.






