## Committee To Meet Jan. 20

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The USDA's Flue-Cured Tobacco Advisory Committee will meet Jan. 20 in Raleigh, N.C.

Kathleen A. Merrigan, administrator of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, said the committee will consider recommendations on the inspection certificate, discuss the bale experiment for the upcoming marketing season, and other related matters for the 2000 flue-cured tobacco marketing

season.

The 39-member committee, established by the secretary of agriculture, provides information essential to the orderly marketing of flue-cured tobacco.

The meeting is open to the public and will begin at 9 a.m. in the Flue-Cured Tobacco Cooperative Stabilization Corporation Building, Rm. 223, 1306 Annapolis Dr., Raleigh, N.C.

Details of the meeting will be published in the Dec. 23 Federal Register.

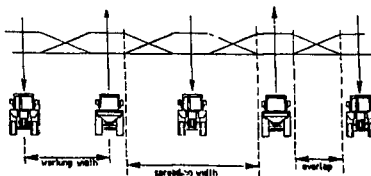
