## **Pfautz Wins National Title, Hopes Farm Show Trophy**

stock that his 21-year-old brother Corey and he have worked hard to perfect.

"It's genetics — all the genetics," Kevin said of raising champion stock.

Feed, exercise, care - all have little influence on the outcome of a genetically sound hog, Kevin believes.


Kevin said a champion hog should demonstrate soundness, be free moving, and have structural make up with a long and level rump, and flex and cushion in the hocks.

Recognizing positive and negative characteristics of hogs comes easy to Kevin, who has been around pigs most of his life. His parents Rick and Sue raised hogs as an extension of Rick's own involvement in showing in 4-H.
