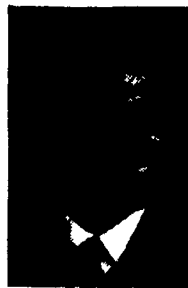
Tina Gromley

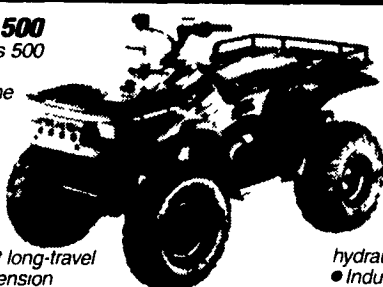
