Three-year Manor FFA member Amanda Jean Hamish plans to further her education in agriculture, "live my life for God, and eventually get married and live on a farm," she wrote.


Amanda also noted why she enjoys being a member of FFA. "The lasting friendships I have made and the many skills I have learned that I can apply to daily life."
