Reserve also went to the Wetzels for the February gilt, a gilt which Brock pointed out amazed him when he chose it for February class champion. To have a gilt that was big and open with muscle and "still be structurally correct," he noted, was amazing. The reserve was KWF 19 MS Tonto Gonzal (S: SC7 Austin 97 39-2, D: KWF17 Ms Tonto Gonzal 8-10), a tremendous gilt, Brock noted, for its combination of traits.

Hampshires

From her profile, the February gilt was a pretty one, "big and tall and beautiful," said Brock. The gilt, shown by Brandon Winebark of Winebark's Hampshires, Myerstown, "has the most potential to make hogs better in the Hampshire breed," Brock said.

Brandon exhibited KLV9 Golden Girl 1-8 (S: JZP5 Golden Icon 44-5, D: KLV6 Bobbi Franchise 2-1).

The reserve champion, shown by Brandon's sister, Janine, exhibited the most in terms of breed characteristics. Janine exhibited KLV9 Golden Girl 1-7.

Landraces

Brock was impressed with the March gilt shown by Grant A. Lazarus III, Germansville, LAG9 MS Data Unique (S: LAG7 Data Aris 10-8, D: LAG7 Ms Milkman's Uni 1-3). The gilt tied it all together, noted Brock — it's "durable and feminine and broody and puts it all together very nicely," he said.

Reserve went to the "second most progressive" gilt, the March second place gilt shown by George P. Billig, New Tripoli, BGP9 Kate (S: SB16 Maxwell 906 96-6, D: BGP8 Kate 9-7).

Polands

The March Poland China moved a little more freely and was more complete in muscle than others during competition, Brock noted.

The grand champion went to Melana Lovell, Maple Spring Farm, Linden, for MEL9 Miss Zena 29380003 (S: KWB8 Concrete Is Bionic 3-4, D: ZB7 Miss Ice 6-7).

Reserve went to Cheryl Bennecoff, Kutztown, for CAB9 Awesome Oak (S: DDP6 Awesome 23-5, D: CAB3 F Miss Cruiser).

Spotteds

The big black gilt shown by Grant Lazarus "easily puts the most together," Brock noted, in terms of skeletal extension and length of body. The grand champion went to Leslie/Lazarus Brothers, Germansville, for the January gilt, LLB9 Ham & Loin (S: ZSF6 H&L 10-3, D: LLB7 Justice 7-5).

Reserve went to the "widthy" February gilt, LLB9 Dex Stand, also shown by Leslie/Lazarus Brothers.

Yorkshires

The February gilt, a "stout brood sow," noted Brock, was "adequate in all traits." It beat out the March gilt, one of the most challenging classes, even though the March gilt was a "real complete gilt."

The grand champion was shown by Rattlesnake Mt. Farms, CBH9 Sue (S: CLL5 Roc Challenge 6-10, D: CBH7 Sue 22-6). The reserve was the January gilt, a gilt Brock said is a hog that points to the most important Yorkshire traits and is

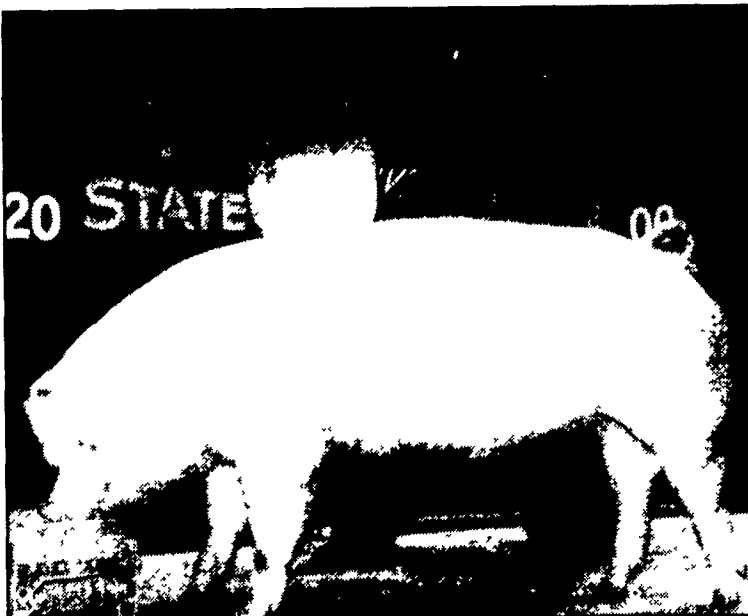

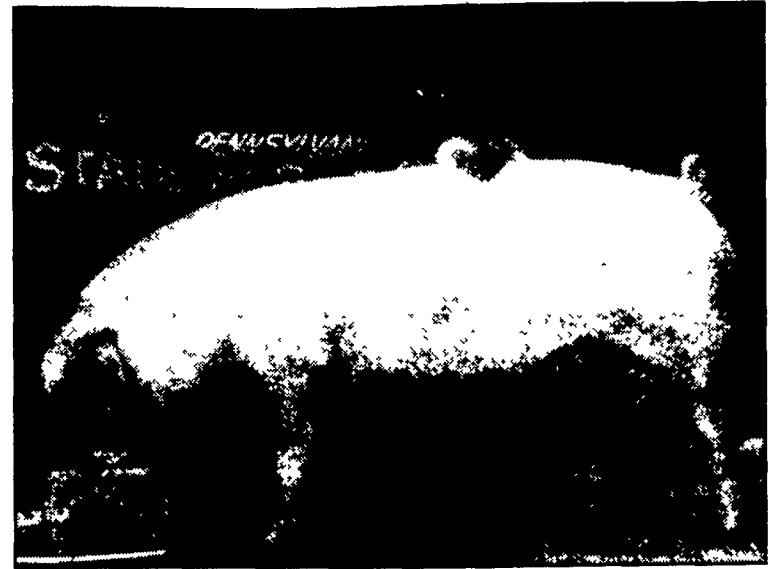
Reserve champion Spotted China gilt was won by Lazarus Brothers. At left is Lorissa Lazarus and right is John Strawbridge.



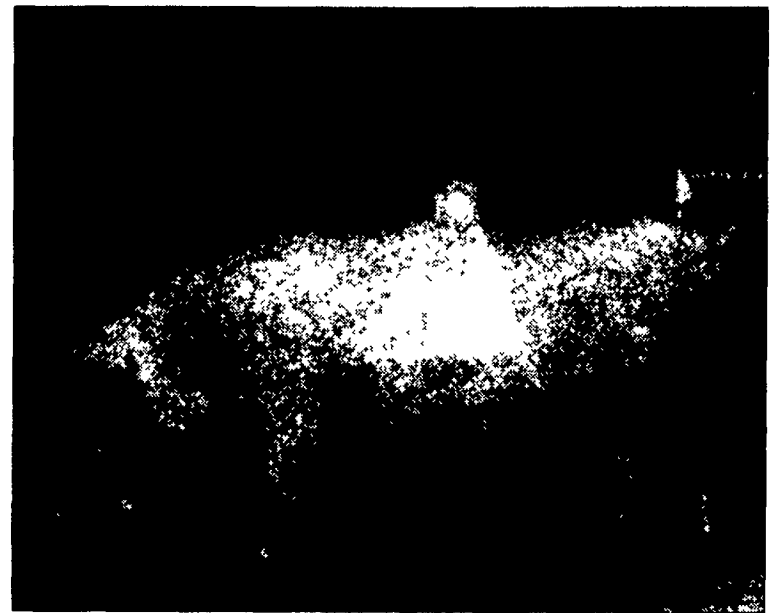
Spotted gilt champion went to Lazarus Brothers at the Farm Show. From left, Lorissa Lazarus and Grant Lazarus Jr.



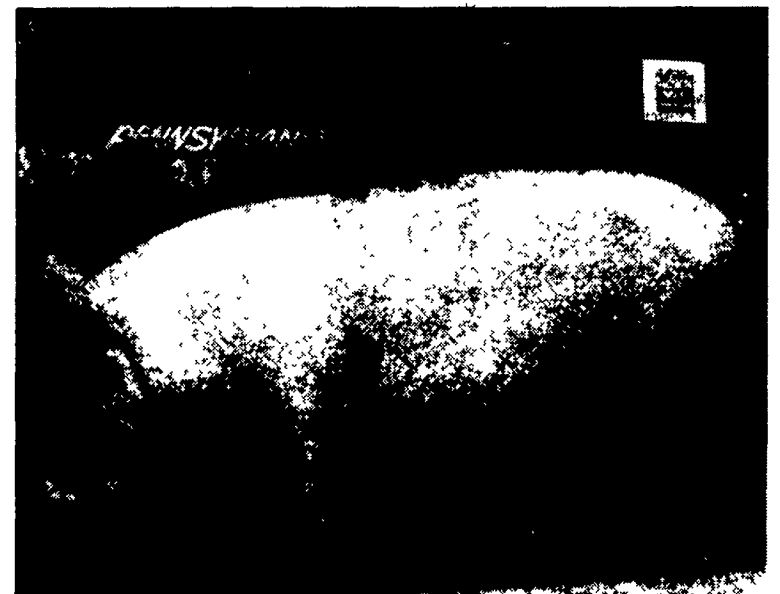
Ken Wetzel exhibited the grand champion Chester White gilt at the Farm Show.
