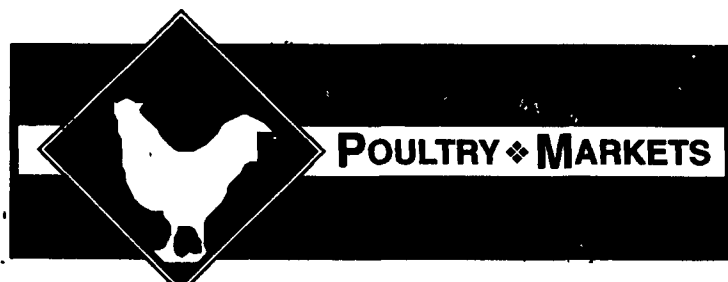

The market tone was fully steady to firm on breast items. Wings were barely steady to weak. Other items were generally about steady.

In Chicago, prices were lower. In the Eastern region, prices were unchanged to lower. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged barely steady to mostly weak. Retail demand was generally light to no better than moderate, and was best for the occasional retail feature. Supplies were at least adequate to ample, however, mediums were usually in the better position. Breaking stock supplies were adequate from regular sources, and demand for additional product was often limited as dealers watched market developments. Light type hens were fully sufficient for immediate slaughter requirements.
