IN BOSTON, PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS LOWER FOR THE LARGER SIZES AND UNCHANGED FOR MEDIUMS. PRICES PAID TO PRODUCERS IN NEW ENGLAND WERE 3 CENTS LOWER FOR EXTRA LARGE AND 2 CENTS LOWER FOR LARGE AND UNCHANGED ON THE BALANCE OF SIZES. TRADE SENTIMENT REMAINED HIGHLY UNSETTLED AND RANGED FROM BARELY STEADY TO MOSTLY WEAK. DEMAND WAS LIGHT TO USUALLY FAIR. SUPPLIES WERE FULLY ADEQUATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was being affected by harsh winter weather conditions and forecasts of heavy snow in both production and shipping channels. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were just moderate at best and most plants have planned to close early to avoid the hazardous conditions expected throughout the area. Some plants plan to operate on Saturday. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 44 to 56 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. Bone-in and boneless skinless breasts were tight, leg cuts were adequate, and wings were ample.
