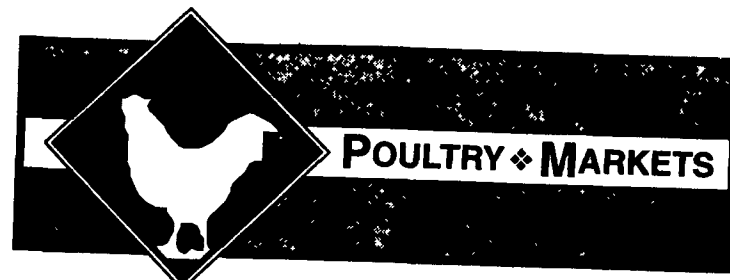

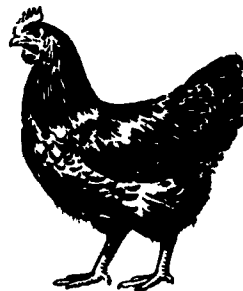

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was just fair at best; however, offerings were limited due to the recent plant closings brought about by adverse weather conditions. Live supplies were moderate to heavy; weights were often heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderately heavy and several plants were expecting to operate this Saturday. Less than truckload asking prices were 1 cent higher at 46 to 58 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to firm, sometimes cautious. In the parts complex, Boneless skinless breasts and bone-in breast were in short supply. Leg items were adequate. Wings were in excess.
