Strength was based on the short supply of high quality black steers. The speed of the sale was sluggish, again this week, which hampered trading. A good test of Holstein steers sold fully steady. Slaughter cows were active and mostly steady to .50 higher, while slaughter bulls sold steady to 1.00 higher. Supply included 30 percent slaughter steers and 58 percent slaughter cows.

Market indicators were only slightly higher this week, but the Western cattle market found support as we enter the spot futures trading month with cash cattle at a 2.00 discount. Major feedlot areas sold cattle steady to 1.00 higher with some dressed sales as much as 2.00 higher at 68.00-69.50 and 108.00 to mostly 109.00 dressed. Demand continues good for Holstein steers and local prices ended fully steady. Slaughter cow trading was very active this week, with prices trending .50-1.50 higher. Slaughter bulls sold 1.00-3.00 lower that last week's active snow market. Supply included 31 percent slaughter steers, 5 percent slaughter heifers, 56 percent slaughter cows, 3 percent bulls, with the balance feeders.
