

 Student Recognition Contest -cash awards to encourage graduating college seniors to work with dairy cattle after graduation. Must be nominated by college or university.

•Progressive Dairy Producer Award-three \$2,000 educational travel awards targeting outstanding young dairy producers 21-45 years of age.

Deadline for applications for all awards and scholarships is March 15, 2000.
