IN NEW ENGLAND, PRICES WERE 4 CENTS HIGHER ON EXTRA LARGE THROUGH MEDIUM AND UN-CHANGED ON THE BALANCE OF SIZES. THE MARKET TONE RE-MAINED FIRM. DEMAND WAS MIXED AND RANGED FROM FAIRLY GOOD TO GOOD, BEST INTO LIMITED FEATURE ACTIV-ITY, SUPPLIES WERE CLOSE TO TIGHT FOR THE LARGER SIZES AND THE SMALLER SIZES WERE ADEQUATE TO SHORT. 
