Daily National Grain Market Summary
Grain and soybean bids gained some ground today, supported by improved export wheat sales, short coverings ahead of Friday's USDA supply/demand report and light fund buying on the Board. Wheat 1 to 9 cents higher. Corn 1 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 2 cents higher. Soybeans 3 to 5 cents higher. Wheat bids were moderately higher as good overnight export purchases added strength. Warm temperatures and dry conditions in the Plains areas have traders concerned that wheat may come out of dormancy early and increase the risk of freeze damage later. Forecasts continue to call for dry weather in the Plains this week. Slight advances in corn pits were due to light farmer selling and higher soybean bids. Export sales have been very slow this week and concerns over Chinese competition, limited gains. Dry conditions continue in the Midwest areas. Soybean bids were slightly higher, also, as South American weather continues to be favorable for yield improvements. Traders await USDA's report due out Friday and short coverings are being seen. Some light fund

buying was also noted on the Board, today.

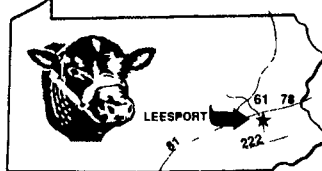

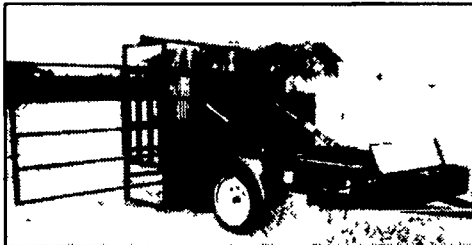

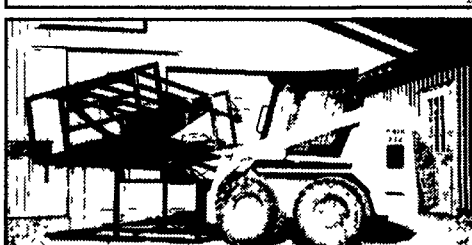
