STUFFED PORK CHOPS

8 pork chops, 1/2 inch thick 1 large onion, chopped 2 tablespoons olive oil 2 cups seasoned croutons 2 cups chopped apples 1/3 cup raisins 1/4 teaspoon pepper 1/4 teaspoon sage

near pork chops and set aside. Sauté onion in **U**olive oil, then stir in remaining stuffing ingredients and seasonings. Cook until warm. Place 4 pork chops into the

bottom of an ovenproof casserole. Spoon stuffing over these and top with remaining chops. Bake uncovered at 350° F for about 1 hour.


