Many cattle were discounted for carrying excess mud. A good run of Holstein steers sold steady. Slaughter heifers sold firm as steer buyers turned to the females trying fill orders. Slaughter cow

prices were .50 to mostly 1.00 lower and slaughter bulls sold steady. Supply included 36 percent slaughter steers and 47 percent slaughter cows.
