Shell egg supplies were irregular but about adequate for trade needs.

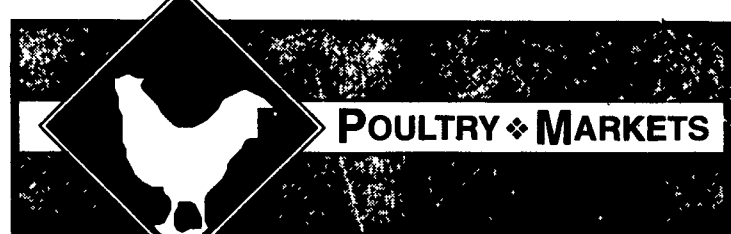

Prices ranged from unchanged to mostly sharply lower in the major terminal markets. However, in the New England area jumbos and small eggs were unchanged. The market tone was mostly weak at current values. Demand remained mixed and usually in a full range, with best interest on limited feature activity. Supplies of all sizes were reported as adequate to fully adequate with mediums sometimes noted as increasing in availability. Breaking stock supplies were adequate from regular sources, however, demand was unaggressive as traders watch further market developments. Light type fowl were sufficient for current processing schedules.
