

The Income Protection (IP) crop insurance program is designed to insure the producer against reductions in gross income from insurable reductions in yield or price. This policy pays when the harvested and appraised production, multiplied by the harvest price, are below the IP guarantee. IP projected prices are based on the average of the daily futures market closing prices for the insured crop during the month of February. IP uses the county yield index to adjust IP premium rates. The insurance is provided for an "Enterprise unit" that includes all acreage of the insured crop in the county in which the insured has an

Example 1.

An insured's total guaranteed

Coverage Level = 65% Projected Price = \$2.20 per bushel

Harvest Price = \$3 per bushel Actual Production = 30 bushels per acre

Crop Value = Production to Count (times) Harvest Price - \$90

Revenue Guarantee = Approved APH yield (times) Coverage Level (times) Projected Price

IP Indemnity (return to crop insurance coverage) = Revenue Guarantee - Crop Value \$100.10-\$90 = \$10.10

In example 1, the large yield loss is partially offset by the increased price at harvest. The resulting crop value of \$90 is still less than the Revenue Guarantee by \$10.10, so an indemnity payment is made to the producer. Example 2.

Harvest Price ends up lower than Projected Price - With a 34% Production Loss

Approved APH yield = 70bushels per acre

Coverage Level = 65% Projected Price = \$2.20 per

bushel Harvest Price = \$1.35 per bushel

Actual Production = 46 bushels per acre

Crop Value = Production to Count (times) Harvest Price = \$62.10

Revenue Guarantee = Approved APH yield (times) Coverage Level (times) Projected Price

IP Indemnity (return to crop insurance coverage) = Revenue Guarantee — Crop Value \$100.10 \$62.10 = \$38

In example 2, a large drop in price combines with a small pro-

duction loss to produce a calculated crop value of \$62.10 and an IP indemnity payment of \$38 per acre.

**Excluded Events** 

Exclusions are the same as the MPCI policy. Additionally, coverage is not available for high-risk land.

## **Rating and Producer Subsidy**


The rating method for Income Protection reflects historic yield variation and variation in gross income due uto yield and price movements during the crop year. The rating model includes the correlation of national prices and county yields. Income Protection premium rates are based upon the individual yield data reported, the relationship of each of those yields to the county average for that year, and the Projected Price level.

Since the subsidy is based on the value of the 50 percent Income Protection premium, individual premium subsidies may be more or less than would be paid for MPCI. On the average, the premium subsidy is expected to be about the same as for MPCI. **Important Facts** 

The IP plan guarantees revenues, as opposed to the yields backed by the CAT and MPCI. However, IP contains no feature for increasing revenue coverage if prices increase, or provisions for basic or optional units.

Where to purchase insurance?


