

Harvatiné Awarded CME Scholarship

STATE COLLEGE (Centre Co.)—Kevin Harvatiné, a junior in animal sciences at Penn State University, is one of 16 recipients nationwide of a \$1,200 scholarship from the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

The scholarships were awarded to students who intend to pursue a career in the beef industry and who represent future industry leaders. Award recipients must be enrolled as undergraduates in the College of Agriculture at a four-year institution. They are selected based on a written essay discussing an issue confronting the beef industry and offering solutions.

The title of Harvatiné's essay was "Marketing Based Manage-

ment," which described focusing the industry on a strategy based on "maximizing long term profits by satisfying consumer needs at a profit."

Harvatiné, the son of Paul and Susan Harvatiné, Thompson, Susquehanna County, is active in many extracurricular activities in the Department of Dairy & Animal Science and the College of Agriculture Sciences while consistently attaining Dean's List. Committees and activities in the Block and Bridle Club, Dairy Science Club, and Ag Advocates take up a large portion of his time, along with being a past officer in Alpha Zeta, an honorary agricultural fraternity.

Harvatiné also participates in undergraduate research and is working on an independent research project that he will present at the summer meeting

of the American Dairy Science Association. His future plans include a career in an agricultural support industry where he can help producers remain profitable and competitive.

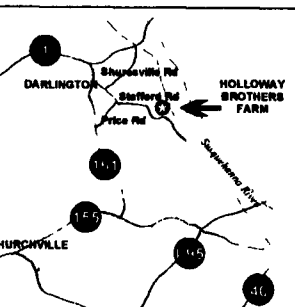
