

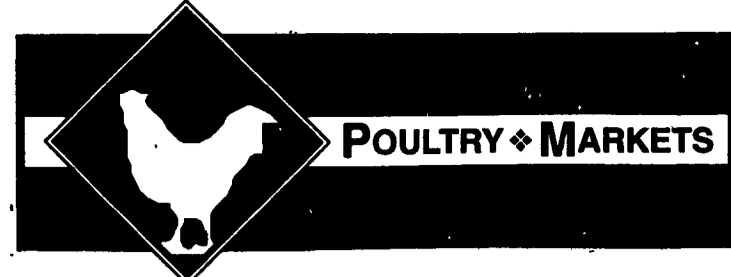

Trading was light as buyers wait on further
market developments. The undertone was
unsettled and somewhat cautious. Liquid
and frozen eggs (ingredients included) pro-
cessed under federal inspection in the East-
ern region for the week ending February
19, 2000 were 3% more than last week, and
unchanged when compared to a year ago.
Shell egg supplies were fully adequate for
full trade needs.
