4 cups flour 1 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon baking powder 1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 cup sugar 2 cups raisins or currents 1/4 cup butter, softened 1-3/4 cups buttermilk 1 egg


n ombine dry ingredients by sifting, then add Uraisins Cut softened butter into dry ingredients Whisk the buttermilk and

egg together, then add it to the flour XXX) mixture Knead briefly on floured surface just until smooth, about 2 minutes Grease two pie pans, divide dough in half, and

press into two round, flattened loaves. Cut crosses into the top of each and bake at 350°F for 40 minutes, or until done


