National Farm-City Council Launches Website

NAPERVILLE, Ill.—The National Farm-City Council announces a Website at www.farmcity.org that will be used to highlight its national activities as well as those of local and state Farm-City organizations.

"The mission of the council is to promote understanding and increase cooperation between rural and urban residents, and the Web offers us great opportunity to communicate with both of those sectors," said Council Chairman Gene Hemphill.

"The council will once again be promoting a National Farm-City event that will draw major media attention to Farm-City Week, which traditionally is the seven days leading up to and including Thanksgiving. This has

been the focus of activities for the organization," he said. The group is exploring a special, nationally-publicized program in Chicago in early November. In addition to the Council, this will include a coalition of agriculturally-based organizations as well as civic and urban officials and city residents.

"We truly want to bridge farm and city," Hemphill said.

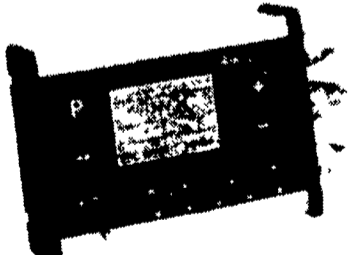

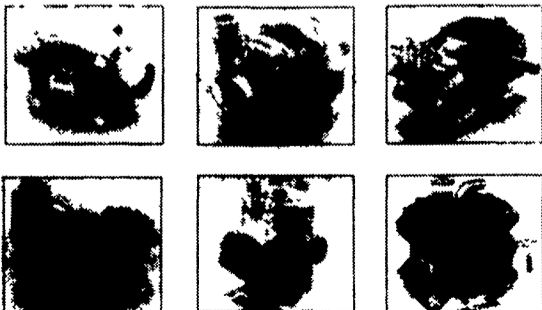

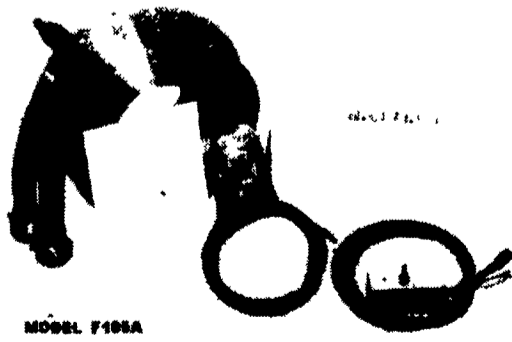
