Weekly Dairy Market Outlook

February Milk **Production up 4.5** Percent

-January revised production up 4.9 percent

-February production per cow is up

-February cow numbers continue to grow

Production per cow in 20 major dairy states averaged 1,505 pounds in February, up 101 pounds from a year ago (without any adjustments for leap year).

Cow numbers on farms in February for 20 major states was 7.77 million head, 72,000 head more than February 1999 and 3,000 head more than January 2000.

USDA also revised January milk production. It was at 12.3 billion nounds and was up 4.9
