Plant Sale Preview Set

NEWARK, Del.-If you are eager for the sight of blooming flowers, join the Friends of the University of Delaware Botanic Gardens (UDBG) for their slideshow preview of the plants being offered in this year's UDBG plant sale.

The free preview will be held Wednesday, March 30, from 7 to 9 p.m. in Newark at the Girl Scout building at 501 South College Avenue (adjacent to the bridge over the railroad tracks). The actual sale will take place during Ag Day on Saturday, April 29, on South Campus.

Oakleaf hydrangea is the featured plant for the UDBG sale 2000. "A garden gem" is how UD horticulture professor John Frett describes the oak-leaf hydrangea, which has gained in popularity, he adds, because it is easy to grow and offers multiple seasons of display.

"The cone-shaped inflorescences of oakleaf hydrangeas are large, reaching as much as 12 inches in length," says Frett. "The plants almost glow in the autumn landscape as the oaklike leaves turn spectacular colors from orange to red to burgundy."

The UDBG's extensive plant sale list also offers hard-to-find perennials and native plants, including a variety of ferns, hollies, hostas and trees. Horticulture experts will be on hand to answer questions, and refreshments will be served.
