MIFFLINBURG (Union Co.) — Penn State Extension in the Central Susquehanna Valley area will sponsor an educational meeting on intensive grazing Thursday, April 20 from 10 a.m. until noon here at the Carriage Corner Restaurant.

All interested persons are welcome to attend.

Guest speaker will be Jim Garner from the Susquehanna County Conservation District. Garner works with graziers in several counties in northeastern Pennsylvania. Jim also operates an intensive grazing system on his home farm.

He milks 50 cows and grazes

40 acres. He will detail his home farm grazing management and supplemental feeding program. Garner will also speak about watering systems from developing a water source to getting water out to paddocks.

There will also be time for informal discussion. Participants are welcome to stay for lunch. Cost of lunch is on your own.
