

Also at the board meeting, Russell Nickel was honored for his work on the farmland preservation board since it was created in 1989.

The farmland preservation program allows the state and counties to purchase development rights, referred to as easements, to guarantee that farms will remain as agricultural land. The funds for farmland preservation in the "Growing Greener" program come from Gov. Ridge's top legislative priority last fall when he signed into law nearly \$650 million to protect open space, eliminate the maintenance backlog in state parks, clean up abandoned

Use of Bulk Tank Milk Somatic Cell Count To Assess Udder Health

Analysis of bulk tank somatic cell counts (BTSCC) along with bulk tank milk culturing for mastitis pathogens can be used effectively to monitor herd udder health status. Bulk tank somatic cell counts (BTSCC) in milk is comprise mostly of leucocytes that enter the udder to destroy mastitis causing bacteria and to repair damaged udder

All milk samples will contain some somatic cells, however their numbers increase considerably when an mastitis causing bacteria cause inflammation, or there is injury to the udder. Injured mammary tissue and high number of somatic cells following an infection can clog the tiny milk ducts in the udder which in turn results in lowered secretion and production.

Although somatic cells are always present in milk, their numbers vary significantly

among both infected and uninfected cows. Variations in SCC are also influenced by the stage of lactation, season of the year, and individual cow response to infection. Taking into account

these factors, it is difficult to assess udder health in a herd from BTSCC's with just one sample.

Work done at Penn State has shown that at least 4-6 raw milk

samples tested for BTSCC over a 8-12 week period to be extremely helpful in making decisions with regard to udder health status of a herd.


