SHEEP Compared to Thursday, slaughter lamb prices were firm with slaughter ewes and aged sheep trading unevenly steady. Receipts were very heavy for the Easter special and set a new record for sheep and goat numbers at New Holland. Buyers were very particular as to quality on both sheep and goats, resulting in the better stock selling higher and the planer types trading lower.
