IN PHILADELPHIA, PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER ON THE LARGER SIZES, AND UNCHANGED TO 4 CENTS LOWER ON MEDIUMS. ELSEWHERE, PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS CAUTIOUSLY STEADY TO WEAK. RETAIL DEMAND WAS SEASONALLY GOOD WITH ATTRACTIVE PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITY USUALLY STIMULATING ADDITIONAL CONSUMER INTEREST. SUPPLIES OF ALL SIZES WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE FROM REGULAR SOURCES, AND DEMAND FOR ADDITIONAL PRODUCT WAS LIMITED AS TRADERS CAUTIOUSLY WATCHED FURTHER MARKET DEVELOPMENTS. LIGHT TYPE FOWL WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE FOR SCHEDULES THAT RANGED FROM NORMAL TO LESS THAN NORMAL.

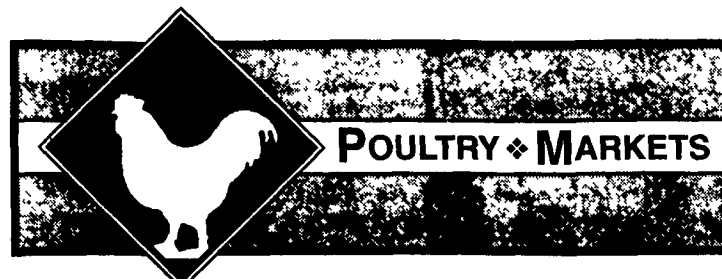

Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate from regular sources, and demand for additional quality product remained limited. Spent hen availability was adequate to ample for normal and reduced schedules.
