## LIBRARY OF CONGRESS **BICENTENNIAL**

appy birthday to the Library of Congress! On April 24, 1800, President John Adams saw fit to set aside \$5,000 to purchase books for use by the United States Congress. In the 200 years since then, the Library of Congress has grown to over 115 million items, housed on about 530 miles of bookshelves. Just a few highlights of

the rare items include John James Audubon's Birds of America, a one- A meter-high book of life-sized bird drawings, the world's largest comic book collection, a book called Old King Cole that is only 1/2 x 1/2 inch in size (about the size of a period), vari-



ous presidential papers dating back to George Washington's term, and the Gutenberg Bible

## SPRING FIDDLEHEADS

12 pounds fiddlehead ferns 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter 4 cloves garlic, minced 2 tablespoons minced shallots 2 tablespoons lemon juice salt and pepper, to taste

Nanch the cleaned **b**picked-over fiddleheads in a large pot of lightly salted water for about 1 minute. Drain and rinse under cold water. Heat the butter in a skiller and saute

the garlic and shallots until aromatic but not browned Add fiddleheads and saute another 1 to 2 minutes Season with lemon juice and salt and pepper, and serve immediately
