

In Chicago and the Eastern region, prices were unchanged to lower on the larger sizes, unchanged on the balance. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged steady at best to weak, and the larger sizes were usually in the weakest position. Retail demand continued light to fair, no better than moderate; and was generally best for the occasional feature. Supplies of the larger sizes remained available to ample, and the medium and lighter weights were generally adequate. Breaking stock offerings were adequate to fully adequate, and demand for additional product was generally light to occasionally moderate.
