JAMESTOWN SETTLED

ay 14, 1607, marked the arrival of the Virginia Company charter settlement in Jamestown, Virginia. A group of 500 or so followed Captain John Smith to the New World. Smith stayed two years to help establish the British settlement. By 1609, however, he had moved along to other explorations and, by

winter's end, the Jamestown crew had dwindled to 60. Winters were hard, supplies scarce, relations with the Algonquians unstable. By one account, at least, the "idle



aristocrats and ne'er-do-wells" that came to settle Jamestown didn't have what it took without Smith's leadership.

SCALLOP CASSEROLE

1 pint fresh scallops, rinsed and trimmed

- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon thyme
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan

n a shallow saucepan, cover scallops with water, add seasonings, and boil gently until scallops begin to shrivel, 3 to 5 minutes. Drain, saving the water, and set scallops aside. In the same pan, melt butter and blend in flour to make a roux. Stir in 1 cup scallop liquid, then the 2 tablespoons of cheese and the cream. Add scallops and pour into a buttered dish.

Top with bread crumbs and the ½ cup cheese, and bake at 350°F for 15 minutes.


