Grain and soybean bids were steady to lower due to wet weather forecasts and profit taking. Overnight export wheat and corn sales limited weakness. Wheat 1 to 8 cents lower. Corn steady to 1 cent lower. Sorghum steady. Soybeans 1 to 5 cents lower.

Slight declines were seen in wheat pits, Wednesday, as beneficial rains fell in winter wheat growing areas. Fair overnight export sales to Japan underpinned bids.

Corn bids were little changed after lower trading early in the day.

Forecasts call for rain in the Corn Belt over the next few days. Good export demand was reported overnight for corn. Wet weather forecast for the Midwest added pressure to bean bids. Profit taking in soybean meal also lower bean bids.


