sociation Applied Food Service Sanitation Certification
Course is scheduled Monday, June 5 from 8:30 a.m. to 4
p.m., June 19 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and on June 26 from 9
a.m. to noon.

The course will be at the Berks County Agricultural
Center, Bern Township. Lunch will be provided on the full
days. The third day will end upon completion of the Na-
tional Restaurant Certification Examination.

The program is co-sponsored by the Penn State Coopera-
tive Extension of Berks County and Penn State-Berks-
Lehigh Valley College.

Class size is limited to the first 35 paid registrants. Regis-
tration will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. Course will
require reading of the textbook and independent study. Cost
for the course is \$100.

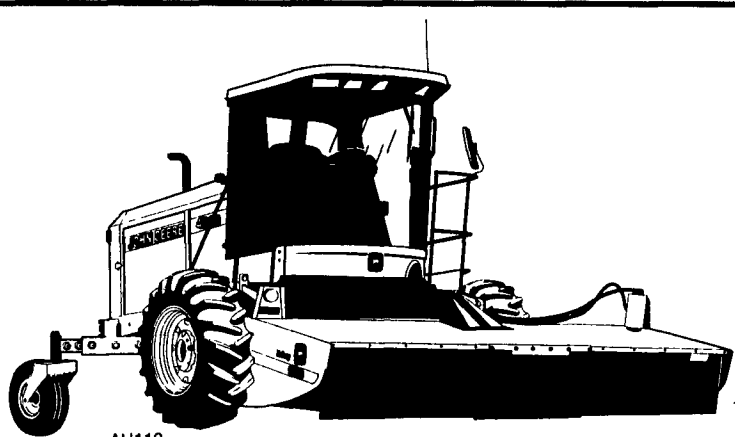
