Teachers Go To School To Learn IPM

UNIVERSITY (Centre Co.) - Responding to proposed K-12 academic standards that call for integrated pest management (IPM) to be taught as part of units on the environment and ecology, the Pennsylvania IPM Program is offering a course to help teachers incorporate IPM into their curriculum.

IPM aims to control pests such as insects, diseases, weeds and animals — by combining physical, biological and chemical tactics that are safe, profitable and environmentally compatible.

The class, "IPM for Teachers K-12: Meeting New Academic Standards," (ENT 497D) will be June 28-30 at Penn State's University Park campus.

"The course will provide the basis for teaching IPM concepts in the classroom, as well as indoor and outdoor activities to demonstrate real-world pest management decision-making skills," said Lyn Garling, education specialist with the Pennsylvania IPM Program at Penn State. "Participants will leave with IPM collection kits, a large notebook, posters, resource lists and several books and 4-H activity guides that will help them understand the concepts involved in IPM."

"IPM combines information about pest identity, biology, and population growth with the use of multiple tactics to prevent or manage pest problems if necessary," said Garling. "IPM activities are well suited for hands-on learning that cuts across the curriculum, from biology, chemistry, and ecology to math and statistics.'


